

## **Overview**

The University of Mississippi is pleased to offer a post-master's specialist degree in education for those interested in play therapy and becoming a Registered Play Therapist (RPT) or School Based (SB-RPT). Our program is provided online for national students.

## Curriculum

Students will complete **25 credit hours**, record at least **600 hours** of play therapy sessions, and receive **50 hours** of supervision by the course instructor who will be a Registered Play Therapist-Supervisor. An on-site residency is required for three days in the summer semester. The residency is held at The University of Mississippi at the COPE Clinic.

## **Admission**

You must apply online with the Graduate School in the Educational Specialist's Degree in Counselor Education with an emphasis in play therapy. **Please submit your application and transcripts by April 1** to begin coursework in the fall semester. You are encouraged to apply and complete your application process as soon as possible for a prompt review and admission decision. Please see admission requirements.

## Admissions Requirements

## License/Certification

- Must have current and active individual state license or certificate from the State Department of Education to practice as a school counselor or school psychologist.
- Licenses accepted include LPC, LCSW, LMFT, LSC, LLP, as well as licensed Psychiatrist and
- psychiatric/ mental health nursing. Licensed school counselors must submit their state certificates from their State Department of Education

## **Educational Degrees**

- Must have earned a master's or higher mental health degree from an accredited institution of higher education.
- Must have also completed designated core graduate coursework, i.e. ethics, child development, theories of personality, principles of psychotherapy, child/adolescent psychopathology, and cultural & social diversity.

## **Clinical Experience**

 Clinical experience required by the State Department of Education school counselor or school psychologist license/certification, plus two (2) years of continuous work in school setting post licensure/certification.

**Criminal Background Check** 

Access to at least 10 hours of play therapy experiences per week
