Like other politicians, Senator James O. Eastland occasionally received original drawings of the political cartoons featuring himself that had appeared in print. The newsprint versions of these and many other cartoons may be discovered throughout the Clippings subseries.

Folder 1-1: Print. "Old Age Pension/Pension for Congress" by L.V.K. of the *Simpson County News* (c. 1943), re: Theodore G. Bilbo, Wall Doxey, Ross Collins. 10 ½ x 14.

Folder 1-2: "There's Many a Slip 'Twixt the Plate and the Lip" by Ralph Faulkner (c. late 1940s), re: President Harry S. Truman, civil rights. 8 ½ x 22.

Folder 1-3: [Eastland Portrait] by Ralph Faulkner (late 1940s). Inscribed: "To My Estimable Amigo 'The Gentleman from Mississippi' U.S. Senator 'Jim' Eastland with the Compliments of the Cartoonist, Ralph Faulkner, P.S. That Necktie Was My Idea. R.F." Matted 23 x 16.

Folder 1-4: "Yep, Harry Old Pal, Your Civil Rights Program Is a 'Wunnaful' Break for Our Gang. We're Headin' South for Dixie Like Our Grand-Daddies did in th' Good Old 'Reconstruction Days.'" by Ralph Faulkner (1948). 15 x 22.

Folder 1-6: "The Carpetbaggers Are Busy Again" by Herbert H. Perry of Eugene, Oregon, re: civil rights, states' rights. 11 ½ x 9 ¾.

Folder 1-7: Proof. "Sen. Eastland" by unknown artist. 3 ¼ x 2 ¼.

Folder 1-8: "7th Term" by Rick Alley (c.1978), re: Eastland candidacy. Framed 14 ¾ x 12.

Folder 1-9: "There's No Comparison" by Bob Howie of the *Jackson Daily News* (c.1966), re: Eastland versus Prentiss Walker election. Framed 14 ¾ x 12.

Folder 1-10: "Plug that Hole!" by Jack Knox of the *Nashville Banner* (March 1959), re: Eastland, Internal Security laws, communism, American Bar Association. Inscribed: "To Senator Eastland with deep admiration and respect – Jack Knox, Mar. 1959." Framed 18 ¾ x 14 ¾.

Folder 1-11: "We're Behind You, Jim" by Bob Howie of the *Jackson Daily News* (c.1960s-70s), re: southern support for Eastland. Framed 14 ¾ x 12.

Folder 1-12: "Judiciary Gravedigger" by Bob Howie of the *Jackson Daily News* (c. 1950s-60s), re: Eastland, Civil Rights bills. Framed 14 ¾ x 12.

Folder 1-13: "Going Up Big Boy" by Ralph Faulkner Sr. (1941), re: Eastland, Leon Henderson, Henry Morgenthau, Cotton, Southern Pine. Inscribed: "To Senator Jim Eastland, with the compliments of the cartoonist, a Texas long-horn who 'cottons' to folks of Jim's fighting caliber, Ralph Faulkner Sr." Note on verso: *Jackson Daily News* 1941. Framed 20 ¼ x 15 ½.

Folder 1-14: "Income Tax Bills Due by Our Fighting Forces" by Ralph Faulkner (c.1940s), re: Eastland. Framed 12 x 9 ¼.

Folder 1-15: Untitled by Gib Crockett of the *Washington Evening Star* (1948), re: Mississippi electoral votes, Eastland, President Harry S. Truman, Fair Employment Practices Commission, Anti-Lynch Bill, Anti-Poll Tax Bill, Civil Rights, parody of *Uncle Tom's Cabin*. Inscribed: "To Sen. Eastland with best regards...that che-e-ild looks safe to me! Gib Crockett, *Star*, Feb. 11 '48." Framed 14 x 15 ¼.

Folder 1-16: "Is Everybody Wrong But Warren?" by Jack Knox of the *Nashville Banner* (c. late 1950s-60s), re: Supreme Court, Chief Justice Earl Warren, Law, Congress. Inscribed: "To Sen. Jim Eastland with kindest regards, sincerely Jack Knox." Framed 18 ¾ x 14 ¾.

Folder 1-17: "The Nail on the Head!" by Cal Alley of the *Memphis Commercial Appeal* (c.1950s-60s), re: Eastland, Supreme Court. Inscribed: "To the Hon. Jim Eastland – Cal Alley." Framed 14 ¾ x 12.

Folder 1-18: "Adult Delinquent Activities" by Daniel Fitzpatrick of the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* (9 April 1958), re: Supreme Court, Eastland, William E. Jenner. Inscribed: "To Senator Eastland – D.R.F." Framed 17 x 13 ½.

Folder 1-19: "Putting the Clamps On!" by Bob Howie of the *Jackson Daily News* (undated), re: Eastland and U.S. policy with regards to Cuba, China, and North Vietnam.

Folder 1-20: "Hold on There, Sam!" by Ralph Faulkner (undated), re: income taxes for armed service personnel.
